Executive Summary

The Annual Student Profile presents data on students for an academic year. Each academic year consists of three semesters - fall, winter, and spring/summer. The Profile includes data for all students, credit and non-credit, enrolled at the College for the last five academic years.

Headcount

Headcount is the number of unique students attending the College. In order to maximize the usefulness and user friendliness of the Workforce and Community Development on-line registration system, it was necessary to structure that system outside of our Banner system which requires a unique student ID. For this reason, this report will detail student and enrollment information for credit students enrolled over the last five years and will provide enrollment information only for the students enrolled in non-credit courses during the same time period.

Over the last academic year, 21,096 students enrolled in at least one credit course. The number of students enrolled in credit courses is a 1.8% increase (+378 students) over the past academic year. Over the last five years, the number of students taking credit courses at the College has increased by 2.1% (20,664 to 21,096).

Enrollments

Enrollments represent the number of registrations in courses – both credit and non-credit. If a student has enrolled in three classes during the academic year, all three enrollments are included in the profile. For the 2017-2018 academic year there were 85,449 enrollments; with 89% in credit courses and the remaining in non-credit courses. Over the last academic year, the number of credit enrollments increased slightly (+174) over the prior academic year (75,648 to 75,822). Between 2016-2017 and 2017-2018, non-credit enrollments increased 5% from 9,194 to 9,627. Over the last five years, enrollments in credit courses have decreased 5% (79,996 to 75,822) while non-credit enrollments decreased by 22% from 12,391 to 9,627.

The credit courses offered at the College are provided by one of the four instructional divisions. For reporting purposes the Arts & Sciences division is presented as Humanities & Social Sciences and Math, Science and Engineering Technologies. The majority of non-credit courses are provided by the Economic & Community Development division. For the 2017-2018 academic year, 38% of the credit enrollments were in the Humanities & Social Sciences division, followed by the Math, Science & Engineering Technologies division with 23%. The Business & Computer Technologies division generated 18% of the credit enrollments, followed by the Advanced Technologies & Public Service Careers division with 11%, and the Health Sciences division with 10%.

Credit disciplines which have at least 100 enrollments for the 2017-2018 year and which have experienced enrollment increases of at least 15% over the last year include the following:

Numerical Control Surgical Technology Union Approved Supervision The majority of non-credit courses are offered through Economic & Community Development with additional classes offered through the Public Service Training academy and Adult Transitions (GED preparation). The scheduling of non-credit courses is based on client interests. For 2017-2018 non-credit courses were offered in 71 different disciplines, however, 45% of the enrollments were concentrated in five areas - Physical Education Activity (1588, 16%), Motorcycle Safety (893, 9%), Skill Building/GED Preparation (710, 7%), Criminal Justice (677, 7%), and Culinary Arts (586, 6%). Non-disciplines which have at least 100 enrollments and saw growth of 10% or more include the following:

Credit Hours

Credit hours are calculated by multiplying the total number of students enrolled by the credit value of a class (applies only to credit courses). During the 2017-2018 academic year, students generated 244,449 credit hours. The total number of credit hours increased 1% (3,078 credits) over the previous academic year. Over the past five academic years, credit hour generation has decreased 2.6% (251,091 to 244,449).

Thirty-nine-percent of the credits for the 2017-2018 academic year were generated in the Humanities & Social Sciences division and 29% in the Math, Science & Engineering Technologies division. The Humanities & Social Sciences division had a 2% decrease in credit hours (95,990 to 94,387) over the last academic year while the Math, Science & Engineering Technologies division had a decrease of 1% (70,774 to 69,798) over the same time period. The Business & Computer Technologies division increased 3% in credit hours (41,516 to 42,832) from the previous academic year and generated 17% of the College's credits for 2017-2018. The Advanced Technology & Public Service Careers division experienced an increase of 13% (19,055 to 21,542) in credit hours over the last year and generated 9% of the College's credits while the Health Sciences division increased 13% (14,036 to 15,891) and generated 6% of the college credits this past year.

Over the course of the 2017-2018 year, a student taking credit courses at the College enrolled in an average 11.6 credits for the year. This is a decrease from the average 11.7 credits in the prior academic year and an average of 12.2 credits from 2013-14. Students taking courses in the Humanities & Social Sciences division enrolled in an average 7.9 credits and the Business & Computer Technologies division had an average of 6.9 credits. Students taking courses in the Math, Science & Engineering Technologies division had an average of 7.0 credits in 2017-2018. Students in the Advanced Technology & Public Service Careers division averaged 5.6 credits while Health Science students averaged 4.4 credits during the last academic year. The change in the average credit hours for Health Science students from an average of 5.8 to 4.4 credits is due to the Health and Fitness Center class, PEA 115, now housed in that division.

Table 9 presents discipline credit hour generation over the last five years. The credit disciplines with at least 100 credits in 2017-2018 which experienced more than a 15% increase in credit hours over the past year include:

Contact Hours

Contact hours are calculated by multiplying the total number of students enrolled by the total contact hours of a class (applies to both credit and non-credit courses). For 2017-2018, the College generated 4,527,397 contact hours which represents a 1.9% increase over the last academic year. Each enrollment in a credit course for the 2017-2018 academic year generated an average of 56.9 contact hours. This compares to 56.3 contact hours per enrollment in 2016-2017. An enrollment in a non-credit course generated an average of 22.1 contact hours for 2017-2018. While enrollments in non-credit courses generated 11% of the enrollments for the year, these same enrollments generated 5% of the contact hours for the year. The Humanities & Social Sciences division generated 32% of the contact hours for this academic year and experienced a 2% decrease compared to the prior academic year. The Math, Science & Engineering Technology division generated 28% of the institutional contact hours and experienced a 1% decrease in hours over the prior year. The Business & Computer Technologies division generated 16% of the institutional contact hours and had a 4% increase over the same time period. The Advanced Technologies & Public Service Careers division, with an increase of 4% in hours, generated 10% of the contact hours for the 2017-2018 academic year. The Health Sciences division had an increase of 14% in contact hours compared to the last year and generated 10% of the institutional contact hours. Contact hours in non-credit offerings increased 14% (188,209 to 214,229) over the last academic year. Four areas generated 66% of the noncredit contact hours for 2017-2018: Skill Building-GED preparation (67,032 hours, 31%), Online Police Academy Firearms (29,400 hours, 14%), Motorcycle Safety (23,174 hours, 11%), and Physical Education Activities (21,197 hours, 10%).

Gender

For the 2017-2018 academic year, 48% of the students enrolled at WCC were female. Over the last year, there was an overall increase of 378 students. The number of female students enrolled

increased by 156 and the number of male students increased by 222. Females comprise 55% of the minority students and 49% of the white students enrolled for credit courses in the 2017-2018 year.

Age

Students enrolled in credit courses during the 2017-2018 academic year had an average age of 27.5 and a median age of 23 years – the same values as in 2016-2017. Over the past five years, the average age has dropped from 28.2 to 27.5.

Graph 6 presents a graph of age frequency for all students enrolled in 2017-2018. The modal (most frequent) age of students at the College during the 2017-2018 year was 19 years (2,183 students) followed by 20 years of age (1,953 students). For the 2017-2018 academic year, 57% of students enrolled in credit courses at the College were under the age of 25 years. Five years ago 53% of the enrolled students were under the age of 25.

Ethnicity

As of 2010, Washtenaw County reports a minority population of 27.7%. WCC has consistently enrolled a greater percentage of minority students than present in the general population of Washtenaw County. For the 2017-2018 academic year, 32.7% of the students reporting ethnicity at the College were minorities. Ethnic information was not provided for 7% of the students enrolled in credit courses for the 2017-2018 academic year. Of the students enrolled in credit courses who provided ethnic information, 15% were African American, 5% were Asian, 7% Hispanic, and 0.5% Native American for the 2017-2018 academic year. An additional 5% of the credit students reported two or more ethnic categories.

Residency Status

Over the course of an academic year, a student's residency status may change from one semester to the next depending upon where the student resides. For this reason, residency status in this profile was calculated based on contact hours (credit and non-credit courses) and credit hours (credit courses only). For the 2017-2018 academic year, in-district (residents of Washtenaw County) students generated 58% of the contact hours and 57% of the credit hours. For this same time period, out-of-district (residing within the state of Michigan, but outside of Washtenaw County) students generated 37% of the contact hours and 37% of the credit hours. Students who are U.S. citizens but reside outside of Michigan, generated 4% of the contact and credit hours for the 2017-2018 academic year. The majority of out-of-state students are UA members enrolled in the summer training program. Students with out-of-country residency status (in the U.S. on a visa) generated 2% of the credit and contact hours for the past academic year. Sixty-three percent of the contact hours in non-credit courses were taken by students who have an in-district residency status.

For the Advanced Technologies & Public Service Careers division, in-district students generated 41% of the contact and 37% of credit hours during the 2017-2018 academic year. Out-of-district students generated 39% of the contact hours and 35% of the credit hours, while out-of-state students generated 19% of the contact hours and 26% of the credit hours. The higher out-of-state numbers are due to UA enrollments. The higher out-district numbers are due to on-campus programs in this division attracting students from counties outside of Washtenaw.

Due to the increased number of out-district students enrolling in on-line courses, all of the

academic divisions experienced increases in the number of out-district contact hours and credit hours generated when compared to the prior year.

Flexible Education Profile

Tables 11 through 13 detail information on students enrolled in courses delivered through multiple flexible modes – Distance Learning (DL), Face to Face (F2F), and Mixed Mode (MM). The Distance Learning courses are fully on-line. Mixed Mode courses use the DL materials, however, half of the course meetings are scheduled on campus for a half on-line/half traditional (F2F) format.

Table 11 details demographic data on students taking some DL courses, only DL courses, or only F2F courses during the year. Fifty-eight percent of students enrolled in F2F classes only while 18% of the students enrolled in only DL courses over the last year. Females comprise 60% of the students enrolled in only DL courses compared to 48% of the entire credit student body. Students in the 25-34 age group comprise 25% of the students enrolled in only DL courses while representing 23% of all credit students. Students in younger age brackets are enrolling in more DL courses.

Table 11.1 provides the profile of students enrolling in DL and MM courses over the past five years. The number of students taking DL and/or MM courses over the last year increased by 11% (8,826 to 9,816). Enrollments in DL courses increased by 12% (from 16,216 to 18,141) over the last year. Over the last five years, enrollments in DL courses have increased 86% from 9,774 to 18,141. DL course enrollments generated 24% of all credit course enrollments in 2017-2018 compared to generating 21% of the credit enrollments in the prior academic year. DL courses generated 58,162 credits in 2017-2018; a 12% increase over the prior academic year. Thirty-seven different disciplines were offered via DL this past year, however, courses in the Business Management (13%), English/Writing (12%), Mathematics (13%), and Psychology (11%) disciplines generated nearly half (49%) of the DL credits for the 2017-2018 year.

New Students

The New Student section of the Annual Student Profile provides an overview of the students who enrolled in credit courses for the first time during the 2017-2018 year. These new students may have been enrolled for the first time during the fall, winter, or spring/summer semester. The profile focuses on new credit students because much of the background information on noncredit students is not available.

During the 2017-2018 academic year 7,840 new credit students enrolled at the College. This is an increase of 258 (+3.4%) students compared to the number of new credit students enrolled in the 2016-2017 academic year. Seventeen-percent (1,350) of the new students entered WCC as college graduates – an increase of 5% over 2016-2017. An additional 3,087 (39%) of the new students had previously attended another college or university prior to enrolling this year. During the 2017-2018 academic year, 780 (10%) of the new students were currently enrolled high school students – an increase of 9% (63 students). The top three high schools enrolling new current high school students in 2017-18 are Washtenaw Technical Middle College (168 students), Ypsilanti Community High (66 students) and Dexter High School (37 students). One of the top 10 high schools to enroll new current high school students is Unionville-Sebewaing (18 students), a district located in the thumb, whose students are taking advantage of our on-line course offerings.

Thirty-two percent (2546) of the entering new students entering 2017-2018 reported graduating from an area high school. The top five feeder high schools were Ann Arbor Pioneer, Saline Area High School, Brighton, Ann Arbor Skyline, and Ann Arbor Huron. Four of the top ten feeder high schools were high schools located outside of Washtenaw County – Brighton High, Belleville, Pinckney High, and Hartland High School.

Forty-five-percent of the new credit students enrolled at the College during the 2017-2018 year reside in zip codes within Washtenaw County. Eighteen-percent reside in Ann Arbor zip codes and 17% reside in Ypsilanti zip code areas. Zip code areas outside of Washtenaw County with the largest number of new credit students include Brighton (280 students, 4%), Canton (264 students, 3%), Howell (222 students, 3%), and Belleville (197 students, 3%).

Program Enrollments

The enrollment, credit, and contact hour data provided earlier in the profile is based on student enrollment in courses. Table 18 provides information on the certificate and degree programs declared by students for each of the last five academic years. The top three certificate and top three associate degree programs for each division for 2017-18 are detailed below. The number of students declaring the certificate program is followed by the percentage of certificate seekers for that division. The number of students declaring the associate degree program is followed by the percentage of degree seekers for that division.

Advanced Technologies & Public Service Careers: Certificates – Welding (92, 15%), Automotive Services Technician (90, 14%), and Child Care & Education (81, 13%). Associate degrees – Criminal Justice (302, 23%), Welding Technology (185, 14%), and Automotive Service Technology (157, 12%). An additional 1,683 United Association students are pursuing an associate degree or certificate in Industrial Training or Construction Supervision. These students are not included in the percentages for this division.

Business & Computer Technologies: Certificates – Accounting for Business (100, 12%), Graphic Design (74, 9%), and Computer Systems Technology and Entrepreneurship & Innovation (each 62, 8%). Associate degrees – Business (1108, 32%), Computer Science: Programming in Java (286, 8%), and Computer Systems & Networking (252, 7%). An additional 293 students (5% of all declared occupational associate degrees) have declared they are pursuing an associate degree in Occupational Studies which may include occupational courses across all divisions. These students are not included in the percentages for the Business & Computer Technologies division.

Health Sciences: Certificates – Health Care Foundations (1,766, 89%), Nursing Assistant Skills (83, 4%), and Medical Billing & Coding (68, 3%). The Health Care Foundations certificate includes students pursuing a health care program requiring additional admission requirements who have not yet been formally admitted to their program. Associate degrees – Health Program Preparation (538, 52%), Nursing (325, 32%), Radiography (87, 8%). The Health Program Preparation is intended for students pursuing a health program with the intention of transferring and completing a health-related Bachelor's degree.

Humanities & Social Sciences: Certificates – Audio Production & Engineering (95, 49%), English as a Second Language (25, 13%), and Music Production/Engineering and Technical

Communication (each 19, 10%). Associate degrees – Liberal Arts Transfer (1,135, 54%), Human Services Transfer (446, 21%), and Elementary Education (175, 8%).

Math, Science & Engineering Technology: Certificates – Commercial Building Facility Maintenance (50, 38%), Engineering & Design Technology (45, 34%), and Construction Technology I (28, 21%). Associate degrees – Math and Science (761, 51%), General Studies – Math & Natural Science (353, 23%), and Environmental Science (135, 9%).

Graduation Awards

Certificates and associate degrees awarded by the College over the past five years are presented in Table 19. Graduation awards are issued in December (end of Fall semester), May (end of Winter semester), June (end of spring session), and August (end of summer session). Annual awards include all four of these postings. Institutionally, the number of certificates awarded has increased 10% (2,568 to 2,817) over the last year. The number of associate degrees awarded increased 1% over the last year (1,287 to 1,293).

The awards issued in the Advanced Technologies & Public Service Careers division increased by 1% over the last year. The programs in this division with the most awards are Child Development certificate (35) followed by Welding & Fabrication Principles (29), and Automotive Services Technician (26) certificates.

The number of awards in the Business division increased 12% (938 to 1,053) over the last academic year. Programs with the greatest number of awards were Core Business Skills certificate (175) followed by Business associate degree (134), and the Accounting for Business certificate (42).

The awards issued for programs in the Health Sciences division increased by 2% (810 to 828) over the past year. The programs with the greatest number of awards were the Nursing Assistant Skills (CENA) certificate (442), Nursing associate degree (105) and the Health Care Foundations certificate (62).

The Humanities & Social Sciences division experienced a 8% increase (1,609 to 1,734) in the number of awards issued over the last year. The programs with the greatest number of awards were Liberal Arts MTA (1,089) and MACRAO (288) certificates and Liberal Arts Transfer associate degree (232).

The awards issued for programs in the Math, Science & Engineering Technology division decreased 6% (127 to 120) over the past year. The programs with the greatest number of awards were General Studies – Math/Natural Sciences associate degree (74), the Math and Science associate degree (17), and the Commercial Building Facility Maintenance certificate (14).

An additional 156 students earned an associate degree in Occupational Studies which may include occupational courses from all of the divisions and is not included in any of the academic division totals.





PROGRAM/COURSE OFFERINGS I 2017-18















Graph 2. Gender by Academic Year




Graph 3. Average Credit Hours by Division



Graph 4. Average Age by Academic Year




Graph 5. Age Categories







Graph 9. Education Level




Education Level by Gender New Students

Graph 10. Area High School Feeders






Graph 11. New Student Zip Codes

Executive Summary

The Annual Financial Aid Profile presents data on financial aid received by students for an academic year. An academic year consists of three semesters – fall, winter and spring/summer. The Profile includes data for all students who received financial aid at the College over the last five academic years.

Washtenaw Community College continues to see a decline in the number of students requesting and receiving financial aid. As the economic recovery remains strong in Washtenaw County, fewer students need financial aid to pay their tuition and college expenses. Many students are working while attending college, reducing their reliance on financial aid. WCC also continues to be focused on affordability with low tuition rates for students.

Financial Aid Headcount

Financial Aid Headcount is the number of unique students who are receiving financial aid at the College. The Financial Aid Office awarded 6,522 students throughout the 2017-2018 academic year. This is a decrease of 2.2% (144 students) compared to the previous academic year. Over an academic year, a student may be counted in at least one of four categories based on the type of financial aid received during the year. The 5,965 students receiving Federal financial aid represents a 2.5% decrease (152 students) over the past academic year. The number of students receiving funds from the State of Michigan increased from 434 to 504 students (16.1%). The number of students who receive funding directly from Washtenaw Community College has decreased by 3.7% (457 to 440) from the previous year. Finally, the 996 students receiving funds from an external source represents an increase of 19.4% (162 students) since the previous academic year.

For the 2017-2018 academic year, 30.9% of WCC students received aid. The percentages for each semester are as follows: 40.3% for Fall 2017, 38.7% for Winter 2018, and 24.6% for Spring/Summer 2018.

Total Financial Aid

Total Financial Aid is the total amount of funds received and awarded to students through the Financial Aid Office. The Financial Aid Office processed \$34,486,681 in financial aid over the 2017-2018 academic year. This is a decrease of 2.1% (\$755,674) over the 2016-2017 academic year. Over the last 5 years, the amount of financial aid received by Washtenaw Community College students has decreased by 15.3% (\$6,207,891).

The amount of financial aid received from Federal sources (\$31,821,004) has decreased by 3.3% (\$1,069,969) over the past academic year, while the amount of financial aid received from the State of Michigan (\$837,867) has increased by 23.7% (\$160,649) over the same period.

Financial aid received from Washtenaw Community College (\$671,470) has decreased by 4.1% (\$28,535) from the previous academic year. The amount of financial aid received on behalf of students from external sources (\$1,156,340) has increased by 18.7% (\$182,181) when compared to the 2016-2017 academic year.

Ethnicity

For the 2017-2018 academic year, 42.3% of financial aid recipients were minority students. That percentage has increased when compared to the 2016-2017 academic year (41.4%). Of the financial aid students providing ethnic information, 25.4% were African-American, 6.7% were Hispanic, 2.4% were Asian and 0.6% were Native-American. An additional 7.0% of financial aid students reported two or more ethnic categories.

Gender

For the 2017-2018 academic year, 59.1% of financial aid students were female. This compares to 48.4% of the entire student body who are female for the same time period.

Source of Funds

Financial aid funds come from four main sources: Federal, State, WCC and External.

Federal Funds

Federal funds consist of grants, work-study and loans. Grant funds include the Federal Pell Grant (Pell), Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG), Federal Perkins Grant, and Fostering Futures. Federal loans are the Federal Direct Subsidized Loan, the Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan and the Federal Direct Parent Loan for Undergraduate Students. In 2017-2018, 5,965 students received \$31,821,004 in Federal financial aid. This represents a 3.3% decrease in dollars since 2016-2017 and a 17.9% decrease over the past 5 years. Of that \$31,821,004 in Federal funds, \$14,329,619 was grant money, \$242,805 was work-study and \$17,248,580 was loan funds.

State Funds

Funds students receive from the State of Michigan include the Michigan Competitive Scholarship, Tuition Incentive Program (TIP), Children of Veterans Grant, Fostering Futures, Gear Up Michigan, and Board of Nursing Scholarship. In 2017-2018, 504 students received \$837,867 in State of Michigan financial aid.

Washtenaw Community College Funds

WCC supports students directly through the following scholarships: Adult Transitions Scholarships, Financial Aid and AVP Book Certificates, Divisional Scholarships, Native American Tuition Grants, Procassini Scholarships, President's Honor Scholarships, High School Excellence Scholarships, Student Resource Center Scholarships, Voice Scholarships, Trustee Awards and Trustee Child Care. In 2017-2018, 440 students received \$671,470 from Washtenaw Community College through these various awards. This total dollar amount has decreased by \$28,535 (4.1%) over 2016-2017.

WCC provides other scholarship which are not processed by the Financial Aid Office and are not detailed in the profile. During 2017-2018, \$676,346 was received by students through these scholarships. This is an increase of \$24,802 (3.7%) over 2016-2017. The scholarships and amounts for 2017-2018 include: Emeritus (\$413,575), Work/Property In-District (\$203,873), Partner High School (\$20,818) and the Livingston County (\$38,080) Scholarships.

External Sources of Funds

External funds are received from External Scholarships and the WCC Foundation. External Scholarships come from various external agencies such as the Ann Arbor Rotary, the American Association of University Women and various Tribal Scholarships. In 2017-2018, 996 students received \$1,156,340 from external sources. This represents an 18.7% increase since 2016-2017 and a 78.4% increase over the last 5 years. The WCC Foundation awarded \$908,948 to 872 students through various WCC Foundation Scholarships in 2017-2018. This represents an increase of \$199,856 (28.2%) compared to the 2016-2017 year.







FALL 2018 FINANCIAL AID STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS


REGISTRATION STATUS






Graph 1. Minority Comparison
