Met Standard of Success: Yes

100% of the 6 students passed at 87% or higher. The benchmark was 85%.

Given their overall performance on the final exam, the students have a basic understanding of the procedures that can be performed by the RDA in the state of Michigan since the 2003/2004 change in the Administrative Rules of the Board of Dentistry.

The validations contain a list of criteria that are expected to be met. Each criteria is evaluated on a pass/fail basis. Validations have numerical scores which are added to obtain a total. Students are expected to obtain 90%.

Met Standard of Success: Yes
5 out of the 6 students scored 100% on all validations.

6 out of 6 students achieved 92% or higher on all validations.

100% of the students correctly performed the skills.

The benchmark was 90% of the students will correctly perform the skills.

7. Based on your interpretation of the assessment results, describe the areas of strength in student achievement of this learning outcome.

Given their overall performance on the validations, the students are exceeding in performing at laboratory and clinical competency.

The validations will continue to be viewed for relevancy given the changes in materials and technology.

FYI the discrepancy with regards to the number of validations in the attached data has to do with the opportunities for clinical practice that the students were given. Also, the Administrative Rules of the Board of Dentistry increased the number of duties the RDA could perform in 2014. Those duties were added to DEN 205 in the Fall of 2014.
